Who can pass through this beautiful season in Michigan and not notice the trees? Color surrounds us and we become intensely aware that change is on the horizon. The trees are producing in one form or another either by beautiful color in landscapes or bountiful harvest in the fruit and nut trees. They truly are amazing influences on our environment and have deep impact in our lives.

Did you know that autumn is a great time to plant a tree? Trees are most successfully planted when they are in a dormant state so handling and transporting have less effects of stress on them.

Deciduous trees give obvious clues when they are entering dormancy by the dropping of their leaves. On the other hand, the unfurling of buds in the spring signals they are coming out of dormancy and beginning active growth again. There is a little more leeway when it comes to planting evergreen trees since they are not as sensitive to the potential shock of planting but hot weather should still be avoided.

The benefits of trees cannot be taken lightly. To the advantage of all of us trees produce oxygen, use carbon dioxide, provide a more peaceful environment, produce food, help to

moderate the climate, improve our air quality, conserve water, harbor wildlife, reduce storm runoff and the possibility of flooding. The natural cycles of plant life and decomposition are present, both above and below the ground continuously improving the soil quality.

Having trees on your personal property can reduce heating and cooling cost, add dollar value, greatly enhance the beauty of your landscape, provide privacy, offer cool shade in the summer and act as a wind break in the winter.

Most tree varieties have potential for long life with years of enjoyment. You may even have had the experience of becoming personally attached to a tree that you or someone you love has planted and nurtured. For this very reason trees often are planted as living memorials.

## Fun Facts

It takes only one day and one acre of trees to generate enough oxygen for eighteen people. This same one acre and one day can remove up to two years worth of carbon dioxide released from a car.

Having one hundred square feet of trees can reduce noise levels by seventy decibels - a difference comparable to a normal conversation versus a plane taking off!

Tree loss around urban areas can cause a temperature incline of three to five percent compared to more rural areas.

Planting thirty trees every year would balance out the emissions generated annually by an average household.

Air conditioning bills can be cut in half by planting as few as three trees in strategic locations near your house.

Trees increase home value by at least five percent and may sometimes have an impact of up to twenty percent.

A higher number of trees in a neighborhood statistically correlates to lower crime rates.

The sight of trees acts as a stress reducer, and sick people are reported to recover more rapidly when trees can be seen from a window.

## Considerations for Early Fall

Plan & order bulbs

Divide hosta and daylilies.

Look for areas to add color with late-blooming perennials like mums, or pansies.

Monitor evergreens and other landscape plants for spider mite and aphid activity.

Inspect plants. Hand prune and destroy any bagworms, fall webworms, and tent caterpillars.

Complete fall lawn seeding projects by mid-September.

## Late Fall

Plant Bulbs

Cut back perennials after a hard frost takes place.

Plan and make any necessary notes for next year's vegetable garden. Top dress perennial beds with leaf compost.

Water evergreens to prepare them for winter, if the fall season is dry.

Remove leaves and other landscape debris from planting areas.

Drain and store hoses for the winter.

Winterize irrigation systems and water features in landscape.
